Judges 4:1-7 Again the Israelites did evil in the eyes of the Lord, now that Ehud was dead. **2** So the Lord sold them into the hands of Jabin king of Canaan, who reigned in Hazor. Sisera, the commander of his army, was based in Harosheth Haggoyim. **3 Because** he had nine hundred chariots fitted with iron and had cruelly oppressed the Israelites for twenty years, they cried to the Lord for help.

Judges 5:6-7 In the days of Shamgar son of Anath, in the days of Jael, the roads were abandoned; travelers took to winding paths. **7** Village life in Israel ceased, ceased until I, Deborah, arose, until I arose, a mother in Israel.

Judges 4:4-7 Now Deborah, a prophet, the wife of Lappidoth, was leading Israel at that time. **5** She held court under the Palm of Deborah between Ramah and Bethel in the hill country of Ephraim, and the Israelites went up to her to have their disputes decided. **6** She sent for Barak son of Abinoam from Kedesh in Naphtali and said to him, “The Lord, the God of Israel, commands you: ‘Go, take with you ten thousand men of Naphtali and Zebulun and lead them up to Mount Tabor. **7** I will lead Sisera, the commander of Jabin’s army, with his chariots and his troops to the Kishon River and give him into your hands.’”

Judges 5:8 When they chose new gods, war came upon the city gates, and not a spear or shield was seen among 40,000 in Israel.

Judges 5:3-5 “Hear, O kings! Give ear, O princes! I, *even* I, will sing to the Lord; I will sing praise to the Lord God of Israel. Lord, when You went out from Seir, When You marched from the field of Edom, The earth trembled and the heavens poured, The clouds also poured water; The mountains gushed before the Lord, This Sinai, before the Lord God of Israel.”

Judges 4:14-17 Then Deborah said to Barak, “Go! **This is the day** the Lord has given Sisera into your hands. Has not the Lord gone ahead of you?” So Barak went down Mount Tabor, with ten thousand men following him. **15** At Barak’s advance, the Lord routed Sisera and all his chariots and army by the sword, and Sisera got down from his chariot and fled on foot.

16 Barak pursued the chariots and army as far as Harosheth Haggoyim, and all Sisera’s troops fell by the sword; not a man was left. **17** Sisera, meanwhile, fled on foot to the tent of Jael, the wife of Heber the Kenite, because there was an alliance between Jabin king of Hazor and the family of Heber the Kenite.

Judges 4:23 **On that day, God subdued Jabin,** the Canaanite king, before the Israelites.

Judges 5:1 **On that day** Deborah and Barak son of Abinoam sang this song:

Judges 5:31 “Thus let all Your enemies perish, O Lord! **But let those who love Him be like the sun When it comes out in full strength.**” So the land had rest for forty years.

1 Thessalonians 5:5-11 **You are all children of the light and children of the day.** We do not belong to the night or to the darkness. **6** So then, let us not be like others, who are asleep, but let us be awake and sober. **7** For those who sleep, sleep at night, and those who get drunk, get drunk at night. **8 But since we belong to the day,** let us be sober, putting on faith and love as a breastplate, and the hope of salvation as a helmet.
